

Replying to Your Mentor

You will get the most out of eMentors if you write smart, thoughtful replies to your mentor. Remember, just like in a spoken conversation, it works best if both sides ask and respond to questions. Take a look at the three strategies below. Make sure that you are doing all three in every message you send to your mentor. You can read through example student messages to see these strategies in action.

React to their story

Make comments and questions about their personal history and other thoughts they shared with you. You can also answer any questions they had for you.

Respond to the prompt

Answer the questions that are provided to you in the week's topic. Expand on your answers and give details.

• Wrap Up with a question

Finish your message with at least one question that you have for your mentor based on what they wrote, or the week's topic. You can also incorporate questions into other paragraphs in your message.
