

Unit Title: Picture Narrative

Grade Level: 5th Grade

Subject Area: English Language Art

Duration/Length/Number of class periods: 50min, 2

Description: Students will narrate a story based on picture.

What Enduring Understandings are desired?

Stories can be told through emotions. Narrators focus on important aspect of the story. Narrators take into consideration the symbolic environment where the story occurred. He/she connects the story from beginning-to-middle-and to the end.

What Essential Questions will be considered?

How can narrators tell story from wordless pictures?

How can he/she determine if his/her interpretation is in alignment with the story?

Students will know / be able to:

Explain their view of the behavior of the army of frog in the story.

Analyze the abstract information effect of the environment on the army of frog in the pages.

Infer the story to their present environment.

Summarize and write a paragraph of the story in Schoology account.
