



Unit Title: Social Justice
Grade Level: 1st Grade

Subject Area: Social Emotional

Duration/Length/Number of class periods: 3 class periods, but on going throughout the year.

**Description:** Students begin to learn about social justice. What it is, where it is found, and how it impacts others.
