Description	Online repository of post-secondary planning resources (timelines, how-to's, financial planning etc.) that is available to both students and their families.
Purpose	In order to make meaningful future plans students ought to assess both personal and practical life factors. There are multiple tools available for students to use, but their families do not often have awareness or access to them. Additionally, students often become overwhelmed with the number of places to find information, this site will allow them to find what they need and sort through information.
