



Unit Title: Bisa Butler

Grade Level: 8th Grade (appropriate for 8-12)

Subject Area: Art

Duration/Length/Number of class periods: Depending on frequency of class periods, 1-3 weeks.

Description: Art students will look at, learn about, interpret, take inspiration from, and reflect on the artwork of Bisa Butler. Students will create collages using "Kool-Aid colors" from a photograph that celebrates their culture.

Intro to Bisa Butler (nearpod) Use nearpod as a large group. Students will get an intro video/interview with the artist, and then have the chance they've learned within nearpod. Photo Selection/Reflection Students will select their photo, create copies of it for use during their collage creation. Write a reflection about why they choose that photo and what message they want it to convey about their culture/identity. \	x			x	х		3a 6b
Collage Creation (sketchpad) Students should upload their photo into sketchpad (https://sketch.io/sketchpad/). They can use this program to plan the "Kool Aid" colors they want to use in their collage. Have students consider the mood/feelings the colors imply. Teacher Demo: Using copies of the photos, students will cut out the shapes of the main image/shadows. They will trace the shapes onto colored paper (the Kool Aid colors they've chosen) or patterned scrapbook paper. Shapes are cut out (Using scissors or xacto knife). Final step is to assemble the collage on white cardstock (similar to a puzzle), layering colors & shapes to create value and the details of the image. Gallery Walk: Students will upload their photo from sketchpad and their final collage to a gallery in schoology. Students can see what their peers have created.
