



Unit Title: How We Organize Ourselves

Grade Level: 1

Subject Area: International Baccalaureate (IB)

Duration/Length/Number of class periods: 4 weeks (3 lessons per week) total of 12 lessons

Description:

How We Organize Ourselves - An inquiry into the interconnectedness of human made systems and communities; the structure and function of organizations; societal decision making; economic activities and their impact of humankind and the environment.

Students will understand:

- Purposes of careers and workplaces within a community
- Tools, skills, and training needed for specific careers
- Jobs in a community are interdependent

Established Goals:

Science: Exploration of tools used by professionals (i.e. vets, dentists, doctors)

MN State Standard 1.1.3.2.1 - Recognize that tools are used by people, including scientists and engineers, to gather information and solve problems. For example: Magnifier, snowplow, calculator.

Social Studies: How careers are constructed based on the needs of the community.

MN State Standard 1.1.1.1.1 - Demonstrate ways good citizens participate in the civic life of their community; explain why participation is important. For example: Ways to participate—pick up trash in the park, vote, help make class decisions.

What Enduring Understandings are desired?

Interconnected roles support our communities.

What **Essential Questions** will be considered?

- What is a career?
- Why do we need careers?
- How do different careers affect a community (include /support)?
- What tools are needed for different careers?

Students will know / be able to:

- Define what a career is.
- Describe why we need careers.
- Explain how careers impact and support the community.
- State the tools, skills and training that are needed for a certain career.
