



Unit Title: Poetry

Grade Level: 3rd

Subject Area: English

Duration/Length/Number of class periods: 5

Description: Our 3rd graders will be learning about the various forms or kinds of poetry. We will focus on Free Verse and Narrative Poems.

We will look at how authors use rhyme and repetition in poetry.

Established Goals: Students will be able to distinguish between different types of poetry, including Free Verse, Limerick and Narrative poems.

Students will be able to create their own Free Verse, Limerick and Narrative poems using Chromebooks, Google Docs and Google Slides. This is in conjunction with state standard:

3.6.2.2 Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly.

And also in conjunction with Narrative poems, apply to state standard:

- 3.6.3.3 Write narratives and other creative texts to develop real or imagined experiences or events using effective technique, descriptive details, and clear event sequences.
 - a. Establish a situation and introduce a narrator and/or characters; organize an event sequence that unfolds naturally.
 - b. Use dialogue and descriptions of action

What Enduring Understandings are desired? Students will develop an understanding that Poetry is an art form with many and distinct forms. Students will develop a deeper understanding of three kinds of poems: Narrative Poems, Free Verse Poems and Limericks. They will also be exposed to other varieties. Students will see poetry as a powerful and effective way to communicate their feelings, opinions and thoughts.

What **Essential Questions** will be considered? What are the different kinds of poems?

What is a Narrative Poem?

What is a Free Verse Poem?

What is a Limerick Poem?

Students will know / be able to:

Recognize, describe and create poems that tell a story (Narrative Poem).

Students will understand that not all poems need to rhyme and many poems do not use rhyme including Free Verse poems.

Day One:

Day Three:

Students can present their poems to their classmates. Students will point out where they saw story elements in the Narrative Poems and humor in their Limericks and rhyme in their Limericks.

Day Four:

Students will have a chance to go to various websites to read a variety of poetry. They also will have a chance to expand on their Poetry Portfolio including Haiku, Concrete and Diamante Poems.

Day Five:

Students get to pick a poem to publish. Students will go through their Poetry Portfolio with a classmate and choose at least 2 poems that they will edit and rewrite making corrections and improvements. Students will then submit their final copies for grading

Students will be given time and extra credit if they read their poem to the class, Students can call on classmates for compliments! To culminate our time students will be given choice time.
