What is a Team?



"A group of 2 or more working together toward a shared objective."

- Teams can be small or large
- Teams can be "formal" or "informal"
- Small teams can be part of larger teams

Formal and Informal Teams

Formal Team

- Structured team
- Specific purpose
- Has a defined leader
- Often have deadlines/timelines
- Everybody has a role

Informal Team

- Can start with anyone
- Common interest




