School-Year Programs

eMENTORS

Empowering students with the knowledge and skills needed for success in school, career, and life.

About the Program: eMentors is an online mentoring program pairing business volunteers with high school classes to participate in an eight-week online mentorship.



Highlights from the year:

- Three new companies joined eMentors: Bremer Bank, Horizontal and Kinneberg Management Group.
- BestPrep developed a new teacher and coordinator request system that is time efficient for both teachers and staff.
- BestPrep offered virtual Meet & Greet events to 286 students from Dassel-Cokato HS and Johnson HS, ensuring students unable to attend in person could still connect with their mentors.

CLOUD COACH

Strengthening student motivation to succeed in school and beyond.

About the Program: Cloud Coach is an online mentoring program inspiring students to develop career aspirations and understand the importance of high school graduation. The program is provided to the entire ninth grade class of participating Minneapolis and St. Paul high schools.



Highlights from the year:

- To support BestPrep's growing volunteer need, Xcel Energy increased their volunteerism by 167%.
- Our partners, the Minnesota Timberwolves and Minnesota Twins, provided game tickets as participation incentives for students, increasing the number of messages written.
- Arby's Restaurants donated 1,000 sandwich coupons as a reward to Cloud Coach students.

School-Year Programs

CLASSROOM PLUS

Inspiring students to create a vision for their future through career exploration.

About the Program: Classroom Plus offers classroom presentations, mock interviews, workplace tours, and career days at local companies.

Highlights from the year:

- Mock interviews saw a 28% increase in students reached from the previous year.
- A partnership was formed with Construction Careers Foundation and BestPrep hosted a Career Day for their interns.



Motivating students to make sound money management decisions and become financially savvy.

About the Program: Financial Matters offers classroom presentations focused on money management, budgeting, credit, insurance, taxes, and more.

Highlights from the year:

- Introduced a new presentation called Money Personalities that demonstrates to students how their personality, background, and though process can affect their financial decision-making.
- Partnered with the University of Minnesota to launch RentWise 101, a presentation that prepares students with the information they need to rent an apartment.

THE STOCK MARKET GAME™

Teaching students about the global economy, business, and the power of investing.

About the Program: BestPrep is the statewide provider of this national program. Students in grades 4-12 work in teams to invest a virtual \$100,000 in the stock market, which teaches business, economics, investing, teamwork, decision-making, and critical thinking skills.

Highlights from the year:

- Launched a summer session with more than 500 student participants.
- Four Minnesota schools placed nationally in the InvestWrite essay contest.
- Students visited a trade floor during the December awards ceremony at RBC.

MINNESOTA BUSINESS VENTURE

Igniting students' passion to achieve success and develop career aspirations for the future.

About the Program: Two week-long residential camps providing high school students with business, career, and financial literacy skills.

Highlights from the year:

- Student registration reached capacity by mid-March, a new program record!
- A new student leadership role was launched; Operations Associates help facilitate camp activities.
- New partnerships with the Girl Scout Leadership Institute and Metro State University's TRIO program brought in campers.

EDUCATIONAL FORUM

BestPrep hosted the Educational Forum in February 2025, which featured one of the world's leading authorities on Al and Technology, R. David Edelman.

Guests also enjoyed live music from local music group NUNNABOVE.

Keynote R. David Edelman discussed the evolution of AI and how to make sense of it, leaving guests excited to apply it to their life and work. A discussion panel comprised of a student, educator, and business professional joined him on stage to speak on the future of AI, the challenges that arise from it, and our ethical responsibility to use it appropriately.

The program also featured the Student Spotlight Competition which prompted students to reflect on the pros and cons of using artificial intelligence with an essay or art piece. First place winner, Megan Do, was the recipient of the evening's top prize.
